RESIDENT ENGINEER ACADEMY PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Resident Engineer Academy

The Caltrans Division of Local Assistance (<u>DLA</u>) enriches California communities by empowering partners to deliver diverse mobility projects. DLA provides assistance for California Tribes and local public agencies through quarterly webinars, trainings and resources.

The Resident Engineer Academy (REA) is an interactive five-day course that provides core training for California tribal and local public resident engineers, and responsible persons administering construction contracts using federal and state funds.

The Caltrans Local Assistance and Office of Civil Compliance instructors are subject matter experts who apply practical application approaches to deliver process overview, document examples, problem-solving activities, while answering attendees' questions for current projects. The course also provides a unique learning environment designed to promote networking between local agencies.

REA is designed for students who have construction experience as a Resident Engineer, Assistant Resident Engineer, or at minimum a Project Field Inspector. Students are expected to have a minimum of 6-months experience interpreting plans and knowledge of the Caltrans Standard Specifications (<u>Standards</u>) and the Local Assistance Procedures Manual (<u>LAPM</u>). Attendance of the full five-day training is a requirement to receive the REA Certificate of Completion.
