Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE)

What is a DBE?

• Is a for-profit small business that is at least 51% owned by one or more individual(s) who are both socially and economically disadvantaged

Objectives of DBE Program:

- Ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of federally-funded contracts in Caltrans highway, transit and airport financial assistance programs
- Create a level-playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for federallyfunded contracts
- Ensure that only firms that fully meet the eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs
- To promote the use of DBEs in all types of federally-assisted contracts and procurement activities conducted by recipients

Criteria for DBE certification:

- Eligibility requirements are stated in 49 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26
